**IN THE SPIRIT OF SAINT FRANCIS...**

Last weekend, the priests of our parish became the proud “fathers” of 10 adorable ducklings.

About a month ago, a female mallard duck decided to make a nest in the planter outside the rectory. Hidden amongst the herbs in the planter, it was discovered that she had laid eleven eggs, and she faithfully sat on those eggs until they hatched.

Being concerned for her safety, Father Greg gave her food and water so that she didn’t starve while she sat on her eggs. Father David even put an umbrella over her to protect her from the sun and heavy rains.

Last Saturday, Father David noticed that she was not sitting still as usual, and she was moving around, adjusting herself on the nest – the babies were hatching.

Father Greg was concerned that the ducklings would be injured when they left the nest because they had to jump down from the top of the planter, which is about 3 feet high, onto the pavement. He rigged up a ramp for them to climb down.

Later that morning, they watched as the newly hatched ducklings emerged from the nest and jumped down to be with their mother who was waiting for them to follow her to the lake.

Father Greg said that one of them was like a ‘kamikaze’ – he tried to fly down but just fell straight down and crashed on the ground. He sat there for a short time, but then got up and he was alright.



Our newly ordained Father Dawid escorted them, as Momma duck lead her babies to the water. He stopped the traffic for them as they crossed the road to get to the lake.

This is such a beautiful example of respect for life and the love and wonder of God’s creations.

#### ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

##### First Reading: 2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13

Because God was displeased with the actions of David concerning Uriah's death in order to marry Bathsheba, God sent Nathan to reprimand David. Nathan reminds David that God anointed him King of Israel and victor over Saul. David realizes his sin against God, but Nathan continues to reveal to David that the child to be born to him shall die.

##### Second Reading: Galatians 2:16, 19-21

Paul writes of the struggles between Gentiles and Jews who both now profess belief in Christ Jesus. Paul proclaims his life in Christ, working towards unity and faith in the Son of God.

##### Gospel: Luke 7:36—8:3

While Jesus was dining at the home of a Pharisee, a woman of the city who was a sinner, came and anointed his feet with oil. Weeping, her tears fell upon Jesus' feet and she dried them with her hair. Because of the woman's respect and love, Jesus forgives her sins. This causes those present at the table to question who he is.

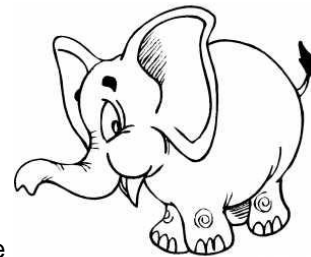
### CATECHISTS NEEDED

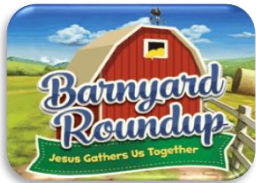
