TOP REASONS TO OPPOSE ASSISTED SUICIDE

Assisted suicide is particularly dangerous to those who are poor, elderly, disabled, or without access to good medical care. The following dangers are among the top reasons to oppose assisted suicide:

PAIN NOT THE PRIMARY ISSUE: According to Oregon and Washington state reports, far more patients sought lethal drugs because they were "less able to engage in activities making life enjoyable," they were "losing autonomy," and they felt they were a "burden" on family, friends, or caregivers than because of a concern about pain. None of these is a morally acceptable reason to deliberately seek one's own death, and many patients are willingly and lovingly cared for by family members and friends who are grateful for every moment spent together before their natural passing

THREATENS IMPROVEMENT OF PALLIATIVE CARE: There is compelling evidence that legalizing assisted suicide undermines efforts to maintain and improve good care for patients nearing the end of life, including patients who never wanted assisted suicide.

NO PSYCHIATRIC EVALUATION OR TREATMENT REQUIRED: Medical literature shows that nearly 95% of those who commit suicide had a diagnosable psychiatric illness (usually treatable depression) in the months preceding suicide. However, the doctor prescribing lethal drugs to assist a suicide and the doctor he/she selects to give a second opinion are not required to refer suicidal patients for psychiatric counseling. If counseling *is* provided to patients seeking assisted suicide, its goal isn't to treat the underlying disorder or depression; its goal is only to determine whether the disorder or depression is "causing impaired judgment." Doctors or counselors can decide that depression is a "completely normal response" to terminal illness, the depressed patient's judgment is declared "not impaired," and so he receives assistance in suicide rather than psychiatric counseling to treat his depression and to prevent his suicide.

FOSTERS DISCRIMINATION: Assisted suicide creates two classes of people: those whose suicides we spend hundreds of millions of dollars each year to prevent and those whose suicides we assist and treat as a positive good. We remove weapons and drugs that can cause harm to one group, while handing deadly drugs to the other, setting up a life-threatening discrimination.



ParishPay has transitioned to **WeShare**. Here are several things to keep in mind as you familiarize yourself with WeShare.

We take security seriously. Donors' recurring donations will continue as scheduled. But donors must authenticate their account and email to receive WeShare emails or to make any changes to their account. The first time a donor enters the system – they will have to go through a one-time validation requiring:

- Their ParishPay user name
 - The last 4 digits of the bank account or credit card used with ParishPay
- And ONE of the following two options:
- Their email address
 - A collection name and the specific amount donated within the last 6 months.
